## ABOUT US


**KMOP, founded in 1977 in Greece**, is a civil society organisation offering social support services and implementing various programs aimed at empowering and enhancing the wellbeing of individuals and communities. In recent years, KMOP has expanded its reach globally, currently having a presence in 5 countries and permanent offices in Athens, Piraeus, Thessaloniki, Brussels, Skopje, and Tirana.

KMOP is dedicated to addressing social challenges through evidence-based solutions that promote individual and collective prosperity. Our focus is on designing and executing innovative social initiatives that enhance individual self-worth, reduce inequality, and foster inclusive and sustainable social development.

KMOP supports and empowers individuals, by equipping them with the skills and competences to unleash their full potential, by educating the professionals that work with them and by raising awareness among the general public. Specifically, the organisation supports people with mental disorders and their families, children and youth with intellectual disabilities, survivors of sexual and gender-based violence, survivors of human trafficking, Roma women, elderly people, single-parent families, LGBTQI+, migrants and refugees, as well as children and students from vulnerable backgrounds.

Over the past 20 years, KMOP has successfully carried out more than 400 social innovation initiatives with the support of both institutional and private donors. The organisation's efforts have benefited over 85,000 individuals.

Furthermore, KMOP has been acknowledged by the state and authorities and has formed permanent cooperation agreements with significant organisations and public institutions. These partnerships include signing memorandums of understanding (MoUs) with the Greek Ministry of Culture and Sports, the Ministry of Education, the Central Union of Municipalities of Greece, the Office of the Greek National Rapporteur on Trafficking in Human Beings, and CISCO's International Center for Digital Transformation and Digital Skills in Greece. We are also active participants in national and international networks relevant to our areas of work, such as COFACE Families Europe, the EQUALS Global Partnership, the Greek National Referral Mechanism for the Protection of Victims of Human Trafficking, and Athens Coordination Center for Migrant and Refugee (ACCMR).


### KMOP SOCIAL NET

KMOP Social Net is a multi-purpose centre that provides support and offers guidance to people facing social, psychological and economic issues. Social Net aims to empower vulnerable individuals by offering free education, information, and empowerment services and initiatives. Our goal is to help these groups enhance their living conditions and become more actively involved in society. As part of its actions, Social Net provides support services to individuals with disabilities and their families, teenagers up to the age of 15 who are at high risk of social exclusion, and older people residing in the Municipality of Piraeus. ### LIVE WITHOUT BULLYING

In 2015, KMOP created "Live Without Bullying" with the purpose of preventing and addressing bullying in schools and online. This innovative platform offers free online counseling services to students, parents, and teachers. "Live Without Bullying" provides a safe space for children and adults to learn about bullying and receive free, anonymous support from expert psychologists who specialise in bullying-related issues. Since its inception, the platform has helped over 30,000 students, parents and educators across Greece. Also, COFACE Families Europe has recognised "Live Without Bullying" as a best practice for addressing bullying in Europe.





## MENTAL HEALTH FACILITIES

KMOP runs four community-based facilities established as part of the mental health deinstitutionalisation program of the Greek Ministry of Health and Welfare. Our facilities include three Group Houses and one Day Care Centre, which provide protection and support services to individuals with mental disorders. The Group Houses, which house a total of 45 residents, offer round-the-clock supervision and support from a team of specialised personnel to people with severe mental disorders. The Day Care Centre provides support services on a yearly basis to about 40 people with moderate chronic mental disorders who are facing social exclusion and marginalisation.

## SOCIAL INNOVATION INITIATIVES

At KMOP, we carry out national, European, and international initiatives with the goal of making a positive impact on society and addressing the most pressing issues of our time. Our work covers a broad range of themes, including Health Promotion and Wellbeing, Human and Fundamental Rights, Education, Civil Society and Democracy, Social Inclusion and Employment, and Arts and Culture. To achieve this, we provide numerous services, educational programs, training materials, and host workshops, trainings and awareness-raising events on these topics. See all our projects [here](#).



### Offering educational programs

As part of our commitment to building inclusive communities and fostering individual wellbeing, we have created over 40 courses designed to help people grow and improve both professionally and personally. So far, these educational programs have impacted the lives of more than 17,500 individuals, providing them with the tools and skills they need to succeed in all aspects of life.

### Raising awareness on social issues

KMOP is committed to raising awareness and fostering dialogue about the most pressing issues our society is facing today. Through a variety of awareness raising activities and events, we aim to inform the public, provide a safe space for public debate regarding crucial societal issues, and encourage action. Over the past year, KMOP has organised more than 70 national and European events with the participation of approximately 10,000 people.

### Contributing to effective policy design

We are dedicated to addressing welfare disparities and promoting prosperity through informed policy recommendations. Our work in the field, combined with the data we collect, provides us with a unique understanding of the challenges faced by communities and individuals. By leveraging this knowledge, we develop and recommend policies that are designed to reduce inequalities and promote a more equitable and prosperous society for all. Our goal is to use our expertise to drive meaningful change and make a positive impact on society and people's lives.

KMOP's "Live Without Bullying" initiative was awarded as one of the most impactful and scalable innovations in education in the "HundrED Global Collection 2023". This international recognition was a testament to LWB's significant impact on education, particularly in the post-Covid era.

### KMOP PARTNERING WITH CISCO'S INTERNATIONAL CENTER FOR DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION AND DIGITAL SKILLS TO COMBAT BULLYING



KMOP has joined forces with CISCO's International Center for Digital Transformation and Digital Skills (DT&S) to provide over 300 primary, middle, and high school students with training and information against school and online bullying. The partnership specifically focuses on the "Learn, Protect, Improve and Contribute" initiative, which involves student visits at the International Centre for Digital Transformation and Digital Skills' premises in Thessaloniki to learn about innovation, modern technologies and practices, and robotics, as well as strategies to identify, prevent, and address incidents of bullying.

### KMOP AND COFACE FAMILIES EUROPE LAUNCH THE E-LEARNING COURSE "SCHOOL BULLYING MANAGEMENT – EFFECTIVE SKILLS FOR EDUCATORS"



In November 2022, KMOP and COFACE Families Europe collaborated to launch a free [e-learning course in English](#), designed for educators worldwide. The course focuses on preventing and managing school bullying to create inclusive learning and social environments that respect diversity, thereby supporting students, schools, and families. ### KMOP PROMOTES THE PRACTICE OF FOSTER CARE FOR UNACCOMPANIED MIGRANT CHILDREN



KMOP worked with a range of organisations, including The Homeproject, Heliakida AMKE, SMAN, Arsis, IOM, UNHCR, GCR, UNICEF, the International Social Service, the Smile of the Child, SOS Children's Villages of Greece, and the Network for Children's Rights, to develop a set of Policy Recommendations that aim to strengthen foster care practices in Greece. In collaboration with 244 professionals and stakeholders in the child welfare, migration, and social protection fields, KMOP explored the legal and policy framework for child protection in Greece and discussed these recommendations to help shape effective policies promoting foster care as an alternative care model, particularly for unaccompanied minors. Specifically, throughout 2022, KMOP organised various events and actively collaborated with representatives from the State, international organisations, and frontline organisations that work to foster and protect unaccompanied children, including the **Special Secretariat for the Protection of Unaccompanied Minors of the Ministry of Migration and Asylum**, the **Greek Ombudsman for Children's Rights**, the **International Organization for Migration (IOM)**, and **UNICEF Greece**. ## EDUCATING HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS ON TRAFFICKING



KMOP, in collaboration with the Reception and Identification Service in Greece, trained 73 healthcare professionals working in the **National Public Health Organisation and the Ministry of Immigration and Asylum** on the subject of human trafficking. Being actively engaged in anti-trafficking efforts, our goal was to enhance the knowledge and skills of professionals in recognising signs of human trafficking, providing gender and trauma-sensitive services, and referring victims to specialized support services. The initiative was warmly welcomed and greeted by representatives of the Hellenic Ministry of Migration and Asylum, including **Manos Logothetis, General Secretary of Reception of Asylum Seekers, Heracles Moskoff, Special Secretary for the Protection of Unaccompanied Minors, and Tasos Mantagaris, Governor of the Reception and Identification Service.**

The training was part of the EU-funded initiative, AMELIE, which focuses on improving responses to human trafficking by increasing the capacity of health providers to safely identify, refer, and provide gender- and trauma-sensitive services to adult women who are victims of trafficking. ## TRAINING OF LAWYERS ON IDENTIFYING, PREVENTING, AND RESPONDING TO TRAFFICKING

In February 2022, KMOP trained 20 lawyers on identifying, preventing, and responding to trafficking in human beings. The goal was to enhance lawyers' abilities to manage the legal issues and requirements of trafficking victims. The online trainings were designed for lawyers who are likely to encounter victims or potential victims of trafficking during their professional activities. 
## KMOP HOSTS EUROPEAN CONFERENCE ON ENHANCING THE ANTI-TRAFFICKING IDENTIFICATION, PREVENTION, AND SUPPORT MECHANISMS



On September 27, KMOP brought together representatives and international experts from distinguished anti-trafficking organisations across Europe – including the **OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR), the International Organization for Migration (IOM), Victim Support Europe (VSE), the International Rescue Committee Germany, and the Federal Judicial Police of Brussels** – to discuss and exchange ideas and best practices for better and more effective coordination of protection and response mechanisms against trafficking. The discussions were held during the international conference titled "Enhancing the anti-trafficking identification, prevention, and support mechanisms", that KMOP organised in Brussels. ## "LISTEN TO THE SIGNS, SEE THE DANGER": A NATIONAL ANTI-TRAFFICKING CAMPAIGN

To mark the **International Day against Human Trafficking 2022**, KMOP launched an awareness raising campaign focused on the issue of trafficking and the imperative need of taking action against it. The "Listen to the signs, see the danger" campaign emphasised on the experiences of the "unseen" victims of trafficking and their stories, and was based on real cases recorded by KMOP in the ACTIVATE manual for lawyers. The campaign was launched in collaboration with the Meteorites Agency.



## WINGS INTERNATIONAL FORUM ON INTEGRATING SURVIVORS OF TRAFFICKING IN THE LABOR MARKET

Aiming to support the promotion of inclusion policies in the workplace, KMOP hosted in its premises in Athens the International Forum "WINGS". Along with European experts and professionals, we shared knowledge and practices about how employers can provide customized career counseling & internships to women survivors of trafficking and help them successfully integrate into the labor market. ### KMOP INVITED TO PARTICIPATE AS AN EXPERT IN EU DISCUSSIONS ON PREVENTING SEXUAL HARASSMENT

KMOP plays an active role in the European Union's discussions and exchange of experiences related to gender equality and prevention of sexual harassment. In September 2022, we participated in the "Preventing Sexual Harassment" exchange of good practice seminar, that was held in Copenhagen, as part of the "[Mutual Learning in gender equality](#)" programme of the European Commission.

Throughout this two-day seminar, we engaged with EU Member State representatives, EU officials, and independent experts to discuss policies and practices related to the field. Natasha Alexopoulou, Project Manager of [TEAMWORK](#), drew upon the lessons learned in TEAMWORK and her expertise in the subject to provide insights on preventing sexual harassment, taking into account the current circumstances, policies, and legislative framework in Greece. ### PROMOTING PRACTICES THAT COMBAT SEXUAL HARASSMENT IN THE WORKPLACE

In a series of conferences and roundtables, organised in February and March 2022, we brought together a wide range of stakeholders – including representatives from the private and public sectors, civil society, academia, and international organisations – to discuss the topic of sexual harassment in the workplace and practices to combat it. ### PROMOTING A PROTECTIVE ENVIRONMENT FOR LGBTQI+ PEOPLE

We take action to strengthen the protection, monitoring and prevention mechanisms as well as combat hate crimes against LGBTQI+ people, by enhancing the skills of public servants to better understand and respond to their needs. KMOP organised the online conference "Promoting a protective environment for LGBTQI+ people" to examine together with the State and CSOs representatives the challenges and barriers faced by the community, particularly in accessing health, public, and mental health services. **Alexis Patelis, Head of the Prime Minister's Economic Office** and member of the **Committee for the drafting of the National Strategy for LGBTQI+ Equality**, was among the keynote speakers. ### KMOP'S RESEARCH INITIATIVE ON TRANSACTIONAL SEX, INVOLVING PEOPLE WITH MIGRANT BACKGROUND

KMOP's research team conducted an extensive field research initiative on the topic of Survival Strategies in migration, with a specific focus on Transactional Sex within the Greek context. Our aim was to gain a deeper understanding of the issue and its impact on the lives of asylum seekers and migrants. To achieve this, we conducted one focus group discussion and 36 in-depth interviews with individuals who had engaged in Transactional Sex, as well as 16 interviews with professionals and stakeholders within the migration sector.



## Raising awareness and strengthening policies on sexual and gender-based violence

### EMPOWERING ROMA WOMEN: KMOP'S DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION INITIATIVES



Aiming to contribute to the prevention and combating of domestic violence against Roma women, we trained more than 60 Roma intercultural mediators and professionals employed in community centres and other local services on preventing and addressing this kind of violence. Moreover, in July 2022, we organised a conference on "Preventing and Combating Domestic Violence Against Roma Women", with the aim to exchange knowledge gained from the PATTERN project's implementation. **George Stamatīs, Secretary General for Social Solidarity & Poverty Alleviation,**

### ADDRESSING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE IN THE PUBLIC DISCOURSE

We raise awareness on the importance of appropriate media coverage of gender-based violence incidents, and the critical role of journalists in ensuring this coverage. In November 2022, KMOP organised an online discussion, in honor of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. The event was attended by 300 participants, and provided a platform for stakeholders to address issues surrounding gender-based violence and the role of media in shaping public perception. The insights gained from the discussion have helped to raise awareness about the importance of responsible media coverage of gender-based violence incidents and its potential impact on society. 
### EDUCATING CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS ON GENDER EQUALITY THROUGH ARTS

We educated children on the topic of gender equality through arts and culture, aiming to create a society that is more inclusive and respectful of gender diversity. By using arts as a medium for education, we aimed to empower children to challenge gender stereotypes and promote equality in their daily lives. ## Taking action to promote mental health and psycho-social support

### THE GENDER TALK: EDUCATING ON GENDER EQUALITY, PSYCHOLOGICAL WELLBEING, SEXUALITY AND AFFECTIVITY FROM AN EARLY AGE



KMOP has initiated a new service, aiming to strengthen existing psychological support mechanisms and offer children aged 10-14 a safe space where they can share their problems and worries with trained professionals. THE GENDER TALK is an online platform aimed at opening a discussion with and for young people on issues such as mental wellbeing, affectivity and sexuality, gender roles and stereotypes. ### TRAINING PROFESSIONALS, CIVIL SERVANTS, AND MEDIA STUDENTS TO PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF RECIPIENTS OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES



KMOP aims to educate and create awareness about the significance of safeguarding and advocating the rights of mental health service recipients and their families. To achieve this, we have conducted comprehensive training sessions, imparting knowledge and insights to individuals, including journalists and journalism students, and municipal officials in the Thessaloniki area.

Through these training sessions, KMOP provided journalists and journalism students with necessary tools and ways of understanding to report on mental health issues sensitively and effectively. Additionally, these sessions provided municipal officials with the knowledge to develop policies and programs that prioritise the well-being and rights of mental health service recipients and their families. ### KMOP SUPPORTS THE NATIONAL DEINSTITUTIONALISATION STRATEGY 2018-2027 IN NORTH MACEDONIA



KMOP, in collaboration with the Association for Support and Development "Humanost", the Municipality of Demir Kapija, the North Macedonian Ministry of Labour and Social Policy, and the EU Delegation, is actively supporting the implementation of the National Deinstitutionalisation Strategy 2018-2027 and North Macedonia's ongoing deinstitutionalisation process.

The aim of this partnership is to foster the development of community-based social services that promote inclusion among individuals with intellectual disabilities in the mainstream community.

In October 2022, KMOP hosted a successful study visit at its two Group Houses in Kapandriti, Greece for our partners from North Macedonia. This event served as a vital step towards our collaborative efforts to transfer our expertise on deinstitutionalisation, including innovative solutions and the challenges that come with it. With this knowledge transfer, our counterparts in North Macedonia will be better equipped to increase their capacities for creating better and more sustainable community-based supported living conditions.

### “BUILDING RESILIENCE IN PRIMARY EDUCATION”: TRAINING FOR ADULT EDUCATORS

KMOP has embarked on a mission to empower adult educators in promoting resilience within the realm of basic education. As part of the RESET project, which seeks to enhance the availability of top-notch educational opportunities designed specifically for educationally disadvantaged adults, KMOP has conducted engaging online training sessions. In total, 170 adult educators participated in these sessions, which equipped them with the necessary skills and knowledge to foster resilience in their classrooms. ### RAISING AWARENESS AMONG HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS ON GOOD PRACTICES IN INTERCULTURAL CARE



KMOP promotes the provision of culturally sensitive care services for individuals from diverse cultural backgrounds. We believe that it is crucial to provide care that is tailored to the specific needs and cultural beliefs of each individual in order to ensure that they receive the highest quality of care possible.

To further this goal, we raised awareness among 80 health professionals about the various aspects of intercultural care in health, social care, and education, during an event that KMOP co-organised with the **Laboratory of Hygiene and Epidemiology at the Department of Public and Community Health of the University of West Attica**. ### REPORT: THE BENEFITS OF ECOTHERAPY FOR PEOPLE WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

KMOP conducted research to explore the attitudes and perceptions of professionals towards ecotherapy as a therapeutic approach, and to identify existing ecotherapy applications and educational programs in Greece. Through this research we communicated the potential benefits of ecotherapy, while providing a valuable resource for professionals who are interested in incorporating ecotherapy into their work. ### KMOP HOSTS INTERNATIONAL EVENT ON REDEFINING WELFARE FOR SHARED SUSTAINABLE PROSPERITY



In March 2022, KMOP and the Ethos Lab - Centre for Governance and Sustainability Research brought together notable representatives from politics and academia to discuss the measurement of welfare disparities across the EU, and policy challenges in delivering welfare. The panel of speakers included distinguished individuals such as **Mikuláš Dzurinda, President of the Wilfried Martens Centre for European Studies and former Prime Minister of Slovakia, Prof. Dame Henrietta Moore of University College London and Founder and Director of the Institute for Global Prosperity, and Prof. Paul Dolan of the London School of Economics and Political Science**. During the event, the speakers emphasised the urgent need for academics, policymakers, and governments to reach a consensus on how to redefine welfare, measure it, and use metrics to develop policies that promote sustainable shared prosperity. ### SUPPORTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE GREEN AGRICULTURE IN KYRGYZSTAN



**270 farmers and young people** were trained on the topics of “Medicinal herbs, species and cultivation”, “Green technologies and small grants on medicinal herbs”, “The basis of business planning and marketing”, “Medicinal herbs cultivation practice.”



**16 farmer communities** were supported through the Small Grant Programme.

KMOP, in collaboration with the Rural Development Fund (RDF) of Kyrgyzstan, worked throughout 2022 to support the development of a Green Agriculture by local communities in Kyrgyzstan. The "Go Green" initiative was implemented to support young farmers in forming small cooperatives for cultivating and producing medicinal herbs through a Grant Scheme. KMOP also assisted local educational institutions by updating their educational curricula on agriculture and the cultivation of medicinal herbs.

### THE PARENTBANK INITIATIVE

#### OUR PROJECT SELECTED AS A “GOOD PRACTICE IN INCLUSIVE ENTREPRENEURSHIP”



Our initiative ParentBank, aiming to facilitate the labor market integration of low-income single parents, was selected as a “Good Practice in Inclusive Entrepreneurship” by the “Action against Hunger Spain”’s European Network of Innovation for Inclusion. The work that KMOP has done during the project implementation was recognised as “a very impactful and inclusive response to the different challenges single parents face in terms of social inclusion and access to the labour market”. In November 2022, KMOP presented the ParentBank initiative in a European event hosted in Madrid, while in

December 2022 we joined other awarded organisations in Turin where we discussed the design and implementation of new projects promoting inclusive entrepreneurship. [You can find more information here.](#)

#### PRESENTING TOOLS AND PRACTICES TO SUPPORT SINGLE PARENTS’ WORK-LIFE BALANCE



Aspiring to raise awareness on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on single parents’ life and work, and to present tools and practices for supporting them, we held a fruitful online discussion, with the participation of 160 people. During the event, **Maria Syrengela, Deputy Minister of Labour and Social Affairs** in charge of **Demographic Policy and Family Issues**, showcased the Greek government's initiatives to assist families and employment.

#### THE EQUALS-EU HACKATHON



KMOP, as an active member of the EQUALS Global Partnership, works towards fostering a more equitable and inclusive digital future for women and girls worldwide. Our Innovation Hackathon, organised in May 2022, brought together men and women graduates in technology, telecommunications, IT, business administration and social sciences to develop new and innovative solutions aimed at bridging the digital divide and promoting gender equality.

#### PROMOTING FEMALE EMPOWERMENT IN THE DIGITAL AGE

KMOP is actively participating in the public dialogue to address the challenges women face in the tech industry and works towards finding solutions to overcome these obstacles. In May 2022, we hosted an online event aimed at empowering women in entrepreneurship. Distinguished leaders from the tech industry shared their valuable insights with an engaged audience of 160 individuals, shedding light on the unique challenges that women face in this field. ##### TRAINING YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS ON HOW TO INTEGRATE THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS IN THEIR OPERATIONS

In December 2022, KMOP trained 20 young entrepreneurs, professionals involved in training and mentoring young entrepreneurs, and individuals who were either currently active or interested in pursuing entrepreneurship, on how to integrate the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into their operations.



### SCALING UP EFFECTIVE PRACTICES IN EDUCATION, MENTAL HEALTH, AND PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE SUCCESSFUL INTEGRATION OF REFUGEE CHILDREN

Thousands of migrant, asylum-seeking and refugee children in Europe do not receive high quality, inclusive education, which affects their academic success, psychosocial development, and chance of successful integration. In this context, KMOP worked together with 8 European universities and organisations to identify and scale up effective practices in education, mental health, and psychosocial support for the successful integration of refugee children in host countries. As part of this initiative, during 2022, we helped 8 schools (7 elementary and 1 high school) and 2 non-formal education centres in Greece, and trained 50 educators on how they can ensure the successful integration of refugee and migrant students in the host communities. ### ENGAGING UNDERPRIVILEGED STUDENTS THROUGH DIALOGIC GATHERINGS



KMOP promotes the practice of Dialogic Gatherings, as a means to engage underprivileged European students, improve their key competences, and promote their inclusion in school and society. In September 2022, we participated along with 31 educators from Serbia, Hungary, Slovenia, Greece, and North Macedonia in the training “Dive in Dialogue - Diversity and Inclusion through Dialogic Gatherings”, which was hosted in Spain by the University of Barcelona. ### KMOP AMONG THE INVITED EXPERTS IN THE RADICALISATION AWARENESS NETWORK (RAN) POLICY SUPPORT TRAINING



In December 2022, KMOP was an invited speaker in the RAN Policy Support Training (Prevent) on “Building trust between state authorities and civil society organisations in P-CVE work in the Western Balkans”, which was organised in North Macedonia by the Center for Study of Democracy.

In the session “Building trust between state and non-state actors in P-CVE”, we presented our research concerning a tool that assesses the trustworthiness of NGOs and CSOs working in the criminal justice sector. The tool examines 6 categories, such as quality and financial management, PCVE training and experience, network and cooperation and assesses those via 40 questions, which lead to an indicative quantified result regarding the organisation's trustworthiness level (High, Medium, Low). ### EMPOWERING YOUTH AGAINST VIOLENT RADICALISATION AND EXTREMISM

KMOP contributes to the prevention of violent radicalisation and extremism among youth, by equipping them with the necessary knowledge and skills to critically analyse information and detect fake news on the internet. In an awareness raising event, that we organised in collaboration with the Mediterranean College, we exchanged ideas with 40 young people on how to counter violent radicalisation and ensure the quality of democracy, along with experienced representatives from international organisations and academia. Among the speakers was **Klimentini Diakomanoli, EU Communication expert- Athens Representation of the European Commission.**

**TRAININGS ON ADDRESSING FAKE NEWS, HATE SPEECH, POPULIST PROPAGANDA AND EXTREMISM**

During 2022, we trained young people on how to tackle a range of issues that threaten the democratic fabric of societies, including fake news, hate speech, populist propaganda, and extremism. The aim of these seminars was to empower youth to recognise and address these challenges by providing them with the knowledge and skills necessary to become active agents of change.

**DISCUSSION WITH STUDENTS ON HOW TO IDENTIFY AND PREVENT POLARISATION AND RADICALISATION**

KMOP engaged in a group discussion with students to address the issue of violent radicalisation and polarisation, during a visit to the 1st Lyceum of Markopoulo in March. The students were given a platform to share their personal experiences and opinions on the matter, while also discussing the mechanisms they have developed to prevent such phenomena. This interaction with the students had a positive impact on their awareness of violent radicalisation and polarisation, while also highlighting the importance of youth engagement in tackling these issues. **KMOP REPORT HIGHLIGHTS OBSTACLES FACED BY REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS IN GREECE FOR POLITICAL AND CIVIC PARTICIPATION**

In an effort to improve the political and civic participation of refugees and migrants in Greece, KMOP has published a report that sheds light on the challenges and obstacles they face. The report focuses on their involvement in political and decision-making processes and highlights the role of Migrant Councils in promoting their rights. By identifying the barriers that prevent refugees and migrants from participating fully in civic and political life, KMOP aims to facilitate the development of policies and initiatives that will enhance their inclusion and integration in Greek society. **KMOP PRESENTS EVALUATION MECHANISM FOR REHABILITATING VIOLENT EXTREMISTS AT POLISH SYMPOSIUM**

At the Symposium for the rehabilitation and reintegration of VETOs in Poland on September 28, KMOP presented its work on the development of an evaluation mechanism to assess the effectiveness of NGOs in rehabilitating violent extremist and radical offenders. The panel discussion focused on the importance of risk assessment mechanisms and multi-stakeholder cooperation for efficient rehabilitation and reintegration of VETOs.

**INTERNATIONAL YOUTH MOBILITY: EMPOWERING EU YOUTH THROUGH INCLUSIVE SPORTS**

During the International Youth Mobility "Engage Connect, Empower EU Youth through sustainable, inclusive and democratic Sport," hosted by KMOP in June 2022 to celebrate the European Year of Youth, we engaged with 40 young people from 6 European countries, and provided them with the opportunity to participate in inclusive sports activities. Through these activities, the participants were able to familiarise themselves with the European youth goals, while also developing essential teamwork, communication, and leadership skills. 
During the International Youth Net Forum held in Palermo in May 2022, KMOP engaged with 20 representatives from youth organisations from Italy, Martinique, Cyprus, Lithuania, and Spain, and exchanged good practices and inspiring initiatives for social regeneration and environmental awareness that they had implemented during the pandemic. ### USING FOOTBALL AS A CATALYST TO ENCOURAGE YOUTH PARTICIPATION IN DEMOCRATIC AND SOCIAL LIFE

In December, KMOP visited the sports facilities of Panerythraikos F.C., where together with the K-17 team we applied the innovative Football 3 methodology to talk about the European Youth Goals and to encourage youth participation in democratic and social life. The football match consisted of three stages: a pre-match discussion where both teams agreed on the rules, the actual match, and a post-match discussion where a mediator brought the teams together to reflect on the match and their adherence to the rules. During these stages, the youth were able to express their expectations, concerns, and ideas for creating a more inclusive and environmentally-friendly future.



### ENHANCING THE DIGITAL AND SOCIAL WELLBEING IN SCHOOLS: TRAINING MATERIAL FOR EDUCATORS



KMOP designed training material for teachers that aims to enhance the digital and social wellbeing of their students. In doing so, we seek to help children develop the appropriate skills in order to lead a healthy online life and boost their social wellbeing. The material is suitable to educators who teach pupils aged 6 - 12 and is informed by the latest, most effective and innovative teaching practices and educational approaches, including ICT tools. ### INTRODUCING THE BENEFITS OF SERVICE-LEARNING FOR STUDENTS

We focus on promoting service-learning as a valuable tool for learning and civic engagement. To achieve this goal, we partnered with the German School of Athens (Deutsche Schule Athen) to organise an event, where we introduced the European initiative "Understanding Service Learning" and provided the public with information about service-learning methodologies. Additionally, we showcased successful practices that have been implemented in Greece, highlighting civil society organisations working in collaboration with schools.

### INITIATIVES TO REDUCE THE SOCIAL EXCLUSION OF PRESCHOOL CHILDREN COMING FROM MARGINALISED CONTEXTS

In partnership with the Regional Directorate of Primary and Secondary Education of Thessaly, we raised awareness among 250 professionals working in education - including teachers from preschool, primary, and secondary schools, as well as nursery school teachers and childminders - on ways to promote educational inclusion and combat social exclusion among preschool children from disadvantaged backgrounds. In an online event that we organised in March 2022, we showcased successful practices that have been implemented to achieve this goal.



### ONLINE SELF-ASSESSMENT TOOL FOR ACTIVE AGEING IN THE WORKPLACE



KMOP created an online tool with the purpose of evaluating active ageing policies within the workplace. This innovative tool is intended to aid employers and HR managers to assess the measures that their companies have implemented to create a welcoming environment for all ages and promote active ageing. With the help of this tool, employers and HR managers can evaluate the effectiveness of their

current policies and identify areas for improvement, while employees can gain insight into the initiatives that their employers have undertaken to promote a positive work environment for individuals of all ages. [The tool is available in Greek here.](#)

### TRAINING PROFESSIONALS AND INDIVIDUALS 60+ ON MENTAL HEALTH AND COGNITIVE EMPOWERMENT

Our objective is to improve the mental health and empower individuals who are 60 years old and above. In February 2022, we trained 15 social workers, psychologists, and individuals 60+ on preventing and addressing mental health issues, managing emotions, and cognitive empowerment of older people. ### RAISING AWARENESS ON THE HEALTH CHALLENGES OLDER PEOPLE FACE

A total of 70 people actively participated in a conference that we organised in May 2022, focusing on the challenges related to the mental and physical health of older individuals, the significance of their activation and empowerment, and the promotion of actions to combat the social exclusion of those who are 60 years old and above. The event was held in cooperation with People Behind at the Serafio of the Municipality of Athens.

### USING STORYTELLING TO EMPOWER OLDER PEOPLE

As part of our ongoing efforts to promote active ageing and social inclusion, we encourage the use of storytelling as a means of empowerment for older individuals. In March 2022, we raised awareness among 40 people about the benefits of storytelling, and showcased a series of initiatives implemented by municipalities and institutions that aim to empower the older individuals and promote their active participation in society. ### COMBATING VIOLENCE IN SPORTS: KMOP'S EFFORTS TO RAISE AWARENESS AND DEVELOP EFFECTIVE POLICIES



KMOP contributes to the prevention and combating of violence in sports, by developing useful educational material for sports clubs and raising awareness among athletes, coaches, and sport professionals on the issue. On February 28th, we gathered together experienced sports representatives, including Takis Lemonis, former coach of Olympiacos F.C., Giorgos Karagkoutis, veteran basketball player, and a representative from the General Secretariat of Sports in Greece, who shared their knowledge and insights on the topic. During the event, we examined the underlying causes of violence in sports and presented effective policies and practices that can prevent and combat the issue both on and off the playing field. The event also highlighted the importance of promoting a culture of fair play, respect, and inclusion in sports, emphasizing the positive impact it can have on society as a whole.
