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
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Message from Dr. Antonia Torrens, General Director, KMOP

About us

KMOP, founded in 1977 in Greece, is a leading civil society organization dedicated to providing social support services and designing and implementing various initiatives that empower and enhance the well-being of individuals and communities. Over the years, KMOP has broadened its impact to a global scale, maintaining a presence in three countries—Greece, Belgium, and North Macedonia—with permanent offices in Athens, Piraeus, Kifissia, Thessaloniki, Brussels, and Skopje.

At the heart of KMOP's mission is the commitment to tackle social challenges through evidence-based solutions that foster individual and collective prosperity. Our approach focuses on creating and implementing innovative social programs designed to build self-worth, reduce inequalities, and promote inclusive and sustainable development.

KMOP empowers individuals by equipping them with essential skills and competencies, training professionals who support them, and raising public awareness. Our efforts support a diverse group including people with mental health issues, children and youth with intellectual disabilities, survivors of sexual and gender-based violence, human trafficking survivors, Roma women, the elderly, single-parent families, the LGBTQI+ community, as well as migrants, refugees, and disadvantaged youths and students.

Over the last two decades, KMOP has launched more than **450 social innovation initiatives**, positively impacting over **200,000 individuals** with the support of both institutional and private donors. **Our achievements have earned recognition and led to lasting partnerships with key public institutions and significant organizations.** Notable collaborations include memorandums of understanding with the Greek Ministry of Culture and Sports, the Ministry of Education, the Central Union of Municipalities of Greece, the Office of the Greek National Rapporteur on Trafficking in Human Beings, and CISCO's International Center for Digital Transformation and Digital Skills in Greece.

Additionally, KMOP actively participates in national and international networks that align with our mission. These include COFACE Families Europe, the EQUALS Global Partnership, the Greek National Referral Mechanism for the Protection of Victims of Human Trafficking, the Athens Coordination Center for Migrant and Refugee (ACCMR), the European Migration Forum, the Radicalisation Awareness Network, DYNAMI network, the Hellenic Platform for Development, and the Diesis Network.

SOCIAL SUPPORT SERVICES

KMOP Social Net

Through KMOP Social Net, we offer educational, informative and empowerment services and activities, such as counseling and psychological support, to individuals facing social, psychological and economic challenges.

Four psychosocial rehabilitation centers

KMOP operates four community-based mental health facilities. **These facilities include three Group Houses and one Day Care Centre, that support individuals with severe and moderate chronic mental disorders.** Providing around-the-clock care, the Group Houses accommodate 45 residents in a supportive and structured environment, focusing on enhancing their daily living skills and overall independence. The Day Care Centre, serving approximately 40 individuals annually, offers a range of therapeutic activities and social engagement opportunities aimed at improving self-esteem, and social skills, and reducing isolation.

Live Without Bullying

Established in 2015, **“Live Without Bullying”** is a **KMOP initiative to combat bullying in schools and online environments.** Through Live Without Bullying, KMOP offers **free, confidential counseling services to students, parents, and educators**, creating a secure environment for discussions about bullying. Expert psychologists specializing in bullying provide support and guidance. Since its launch, the program has assisted over 45,000 individuals. It has been recognized by COFACE Families Europe as a model practice in Europe and received accolades in the **“HundrED Global Collection 2023”** for its significant impact on educational innovation.

In 2023, KMOP Social Net **provided personalized counseling and guidance to 735 individuals**, including 375 elderly, 207 youth, and 153 persons with disabilities. Through over 60,000 sessions, we:

- **Delivered Personalized Counseling:** We customized each session to meet the unique emotional, social, and practical needs of our clients, assisting them in navigating personal and systemic challenges.
- **Offered Psychosocial Support:** Our comprehensive services enhanced mental health and social well-being, fostering healthier interpersonal relationships and stronger community connections.
- **Provided Guidance and Advocacy:** We guided individuals in accessing local resources and services and advocated for necessary adjustments and supports within their community environments.

KMOP Advances Deinstitutionalization Efforts in North Macedonia

Leveraging its 47 years of experience in service provision and 18 years of expertise in deinstitutionalization—replacing long-stay psychiatric hospitals with community-based mental health services—**KMOP has played a pivotal role in supporting North Macedonia's transition towards modern community care for individuals with intellectual disabilities.** For this initiative, KMOP has been in close collaboration with local associations, state authorities, and international bodies under the OASIS project. Key partners include KMOP Skopje, the Association for Support and Development „Humanost“, the Municipality of Demir Kapija, the Ministry of Labour and Social Policy, and the EU Delegation, all dedicated to supporting the National Deinstitutionalisation Strategy 2018-2027.

During the OASIS project's Final Conference on October 2023, in North Macedonia, KMOP and the OASIS consortium demonstrated the **establishment of two Group Homes.** These homes, initiated by KMOP in November 2021 and operated by Humanost, provide a supportive and nurturing environment for 10 individuals with intellectual disabilities.



Further solidifying its commitment to best practices, KMOP introduced the **Community Based Service Model Guide** during the conference. This guide has been instrumental in training staff at the Group Home Units in North Macedonia, ensuring that care is empathetic and adheres to the highest standards in intellectual disability support. The training sessions in November 2021 involved 20 professionals from various fields, including nursing, psychology, management, physiotherapy, and caregiving, equipping them with the necessary skills to deliver exceptional care based on the principles of deinstitutionalization.

KMOP Empowers Youth Workers and Young People on Addressing Gender-Based Discrimination’s Impact on Mental Health

In October 2023, KMOP **enhanced youth workers’ and young people’s understanding of gender-based discrimination’s impact on mental health.** In a 3-hour seminar, 120 participants explored how gender-based discrimination can affect an individual’s mental health, including causing stress, anxiety, depression, and other mental health challenges.

Training Professionals on Art Therapy Techniques for Supporting Youth with Psychological Disorders

In 2023, KMOP trained 120 professionals from civil society, youth groups, mental health services, and the cultural sector **on using art as a healing strategy for youth with psychological disorders.** The training focused on practical methods, such as creative awareness tools & raising awareness campaigns, that professionals can use to help young people address hidden pressures and stressors through art-making and exploration.

KMOP Enhances Mental Health Reporting

In September 2023, KMOP offered training courses **on enhancing mental health reporting to 100 journalists and media students**, in cooperation with the Journalists' Union of Macedonia and Thrace Daily Newspapers. Through these courses, KMOP raised awareness among journalists of issues related to the protection of the rights of recipients of mental health services and mitigated discriminatory discourse and prejudice.

Boosting Students' Wellbeing in School

In 2023, KMOP offered weekly **counseling services to boost the well-being of students** in three schools in Piraeus and Neo Faliro. **A total of 730 students received personalized support through both group and individual sessions led by psychologists.** The aim was to promote their overall well-being, cultivate empathy among their peers, and nurture healthy interpersonal relationships.

In July 2023, KMOP held an online capacity-building seminar specifically designed for HR professionals. Through the seminar, KMOP empowered 130 HR experts with the necessary skills to improve work-life balance for women employees, addressing the unique challenges of the post-Covid era.

This handbook provides employees, HR Professionals, and managers with strategies, practical tips, activities, and theoretical insights on topics, such as workplace challenges, mental well-being, and burnout prevention.

Training HR Professionals on Addressing the Complexities of Work-Life Balance for Women

In July 2023, KMOP trained 130 HR professionals and Managers on how to better support women in the workplace. The training emphasized practical strategies and policies that professionals can adopt to implement flexible working arrangements, create supportive environments, and address the challenges women face in balancing their professional and personal lives.



KMOP Trains Educators On The Inclusion of Children With Intellectual Disabilities In School

In 2023, KMOP trained 550 educators on practices to include children with intellectual disabilities in the school environment. The training focused on understanding the overall philosophy and underlying values of inclusive early years education, the different forms of intellectual disabilities, their implication on the learning capacities of children, and the adjustments needed to ensure they can participate in education.

In 2023, KMOP strengthened the skills and knowledge of 120 professionals working in youth organizations to **include young people with ASD in youth activities**. Participants learned how to enhance the cognitive and social skills of youth with ASD and how to establish safe and inclusive environments within youth organizations.

In 2023, KMOP launched a new handbook to empower youth organizations in **fostering inclusivity and raising awareness about Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)**. It also guides on establishing safe and inclusive environments across physical, structural, and interpersonal levels. Moreover, it features a compilation of successful practices and initiatives from partner countries, serving as both a source of inspiration and a benchmark for best practices.

Joining Forces with COFACE and CISCO to

Raising Awareness Against Bullying Through Sports

We Joined Forces with COFACE and CISCO to Tackle School and Cyber Bullying

For the second consecutive year, our e-learning course -developed in cooperation with COFACE Families Europe- has equipped **2500 educators across Europe** with the skills to **prevent and manage school bullying**. The course **"School Bullying Management – Effective Skills for Educators"** offers interactive training that provides educators with practical knowledge to:

- Understand and identify the characteristics of bullying behavior, including cyberbullying.
- Explain the cycle of bullying and the social dynamics that perpetuate it.
- Equip educators with communication strategies to support victims and reform bullies.
- Develop preventative strategies to foster a positive school environment.
- Promote the adoption of a "whole school approach" to comprehensively address bullying.

Furthermore, in 2023, **KMOP and CISCO's International Centre for Digital Transformation and Skills (DT&S)** educated **1,000 students** from primary, middle, and high schools about school and online bullying. This partnership focused on the "Learn, Protect, Improve, and Contribute" initiative, which involves interactive sessions at CISCO's Thessaloniki center. Through this initiative, KMOP provided students with a dynamic educational experience that merges technology with social skills development.



KMOP Harnesses The Power Of Sports to Raise Awareness Against Bullying

In March 2023, we raised awareness about preventing and combating school violence and bullying along with the Greek General Secretariat of Sports, the Municipality of Alexandroupolis, and the Veteran Basketball Players of Greece. Through this collaboration, we brought together 1,000 students and teachers for a friendly basketball game in Alexandroupolis.

Additionally, in June 2023, our “Live Without Bullying” initiative gained significant recognition and support from European football legend **Clarence Seedorf** at the UEFA Foundation for Children’s “Tackling Racism in Sports” Conference. Seedorf, celebrated his career with top clubs like AFC Ajax, Real Madrid C.F., FC Internazionale Milano, and AC Milan, and currently serving as a board member of the UEFA Foundation for Children, **endorsed KMOP’s efforts in fighting bullying, further highlighting the importance of sports and public figures in addressing social issues.**

KMOP Educates HealthCare Professionals on Human Trafficking Prevention

In 2023, KMOP educated 490 **healthcare professionals** from the National Public Health Organization, the Hellenic Ministry of Migration and Asylum, and the 2nd Health Region of Piraeus and Aegean to **recognize and prevent human trafficking**. Participants enhanced their skills in identifying trafficking indicators, providing gender and trauma-sensitive care, and facilitating referrals to specialized support services.

Strengthening multi-agency cooperation for protecting victims of human trafficking

In May 2023, KMOP carved out a discussion to **bolster multiagency cooperation for the protection of human trafficking victims**. The event offered a space for debate between KMOP's experts and representatives from key institutions, including the Special Secretariat for the Protection of Unaccompanied Minors, the National Reference Mechanism, the Hellenic Ministry of Migration and Asylum, and the Department for Combating Human Trafficking of the Hellenic Police on various topics, such as recognizing signs of human trafficking, delivering gender and trauma-sensitive services, and guiding victims to specialized support services.

The discussion took place at the Library On Gender Equality.



KMOP Advocates for Women Survivors at European Parliament Conference

In December 2023, at the European Parliament, we joined European organizations and stakeholders from the field of human trafficking to explore solutions for the social and economic inclusion of vulnerable women. We shared our experiences and insights gained from providing language courses, psychological support, and employment guidance to women survivors of human trafficking in Greece.



Brightsky Application & site: KMOP joins forces with the Vodafone Foundation in Greece to support those affected by domestic abuse

KMOP in cooperation with the Vodafone Foundation in Greece adapted the “BrightSky” application and site to the Greek context, aiming to provide practical support and information on domestic abuse.

“Bright Sky” is an encrypted mobile phone app available on Google Play and the App Store. It offers comprehensive incident response guidelines for abuse and detailed information on relevant support structures for anyone facing an abusive environment. The content of the application is advisory, empowering users to make decisions about managing their situation or that of their at-risk relatives.

Through a targeted risk assessment questionnaire, the app educates users on recognizing various types of abusive behavior, ranging from sexual abuse and psychological or financial exploitation to on-line harassment and stalking, helping them assess the risks they face. It includes a complete telephone directory of support services in Greece and a step-by-step guide to leaving abusive environments. Additionally, users can store notes and other evidence, which can be provided directly to the police authorities via a built-in button for quick emergency calls.

BrightSky also received the **Gold award in the “CSR Apps”** category at the Hellenic Responsible Business Awards 2023, as well as the **Gold and Platinum awards Public Safety category at the Mobile & IoT Awards 2024.**

Strengthening Social Dialogue On The Inclusion and Protection Of Migrants in Greece

In November 2023, KMOP brought together representatives from the Greek state, 15 civil society organizations, and 150 attendees, including politicians, journalists to exchange information, practices, opinions, and increase engagement for the inclusion and protection of persons with a migrant background in Greece.

The event was inaugurated by **Heracles Moskoff, Secretary General for Vulnerable Persons & Institutional Protection at the Ministry of Migration and Asylum**. In his opening speech, he highlighted the crucial yet often underappreciated contributions of civil society organizations in supporting migrants. He called for enhanced cooperation and intensified efforts among frontline professionals to raise awareness and safeguard vulnerable groups.

KMOP showcased various initiatives that aspire to create **more inclusive and resilient communities**, such as integrating migrants into political and democratic processes, improving access to public services and schools, and promoting socio-economic integration for women from third countries through employment opportunities.

The event featured participation from prominent networks and organizations including the Athens Coordination Center for Migrant and Refugee Issues (ACCMR), ActionAid Hellas, AntetokounBros Academy, Doctors Without the Borders, Metadrasi, and many others, demonstrating a broad commitment to enhancing migrant welfare in Greece.

KMOP Enhances Refugee Children's Integration





In October 2023, KMOP brought together, at the Impact Hub Athens, 12 representatives from social entrepreneurship and the business industry and 150 participants to discuss the role of **social entrepreneurship in bringing about social change, offering opportunities to the most vulnerable and contributing to social cohesion.**



During the event, KMOP representatives highlighted the potential of entrepreneurship as a catalyst for innovation, offering tangible solutions to societal challenges, and engaging marginalized communities in the process. They elaborated on KMOP's support for young entrepreneurs in aligning their endeavors with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), empowering them to establish their social enterprises, and harnessing the principles of the circular economy to fortify youthful entrepreneurship.

KMOP Initiates the First Youth Festival: 'Youth Initiatives in the Spotlight'

In April 2023, KMOP brought together 15 youth organizations and 120 young people in the Youth Festival "Youth Initiatives in the Spotlight". The festival served as a platform to showcase innovative social and environmental endeavors initiated by young minds. The primary aim of KMOP throughout the Youth Festival was to amplify the voices of young people advocating for a better and more sustainable society, foster dialogue between young individuals and youth organizations, and highlight impactful initiatives with positive social and environmental impact.



During the festival, four teams, supported by KMOP, – Foxes, Re-liders, Green Recess, and Bins Mapping – vied for the top spot in the best youth initiative competition. Green Recess triumphed with its project that aims to educate young people and children about the advantages of composting and to advocate for a **more eco-friendly and sustainable lifestyle**.




KMOP Researches Migrants' and Refugees' Civic Participation Across Europe And Greece

The training encompassed topics such as racism in football, the role of coaches in combating discrimination, preventing racism in football, fostering resilience among players, and creating an inclusive environment within a football team.

In 2023, KMOP unveiled a new tool that **evaluates the credibility and capabilities of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) within the criminal justice domain**. Additionally, KMOP showcased its pioneering NGO trustworthiness assessment tool to an audience of 50 practitioners, policymakers, and experts at the “Multi-Ideological Radicalisation Assessment towards Disengagement” Conference.
